



**Beijing/Jiangnan 11-Day Discount Tour (CITT11)**  
**Beijing** 北京 – **Suzhou** 苏州 – **Wuxi** 无锡 – **Nanjing** 南京 – **Shanghai** 上海 –  
**Wuzhen** 乌镇 – **Hangzhou** 杭州

**Please note:**

- \* Prices listed are for a minimum tour group size of 10 people and a Chinese-speaking tour guide.
- \* For groups of less than 10, availability of bilingual English-speaking tour guides is not guaranteed.
- \* The term “Jiangnan” refers to the densely populated region south of (and around) the Yangtze River; it might also be described as “East-Central China.”
- \* Chinese names are written with the simplified characters used in Mainland China.

**Day 1: U.S.A. – Beijing**

Today you will board a plane bound for China, where you will witness the vicissitudes of China’s five thousand-year history. Your tour will begin with the dynamic capital city of **Beijing**.

**Day 2: Arrival in Beijing**

Today, after arriving in Beijing, you will be greeted at the airport by CIT’s professional bilingual tour guide and escorted to the hotel where you will be staying overnight.

**Day 3: Beijing (B/L/D)**

Today you will visit **Tiananmen** (“the Gate of Heavenly Peace”) **Square**. You will make a special trip to see the **National Centre for the Performing Arts**, whose exterior looks like an enormous eggshell. Next, you will tour the **Forbidden City**, which served as the royal palace for 24 consecutive emperors. There you can explore art museums from every dynasty, exhibitions of Qing Dynasty cultural relics, the **Three Great Halls**, the **Palace of Heavenly Purity**, the **Imperial Garden**, and other attractions. In the evening you will stroll along the shore of **Shicha Hai**, a picturesque man-made lake.

**Day 3 Attractions:**

- Tiananmen Square** (天安门广场, Tiānānmén Guǎngchǎng)
- National Centre for the Performing Arts** (国家大剧院, Guójiā Dàjùyuàn)
- Forbidden City** (故宫, Gù Gōng, or 紫禁城, Zǐjìn Chéng)
- Three Great Halls** (三大殿, Sān Dàdiàn)
- Imperial Garden** (御花园, Yùhuā Yuán)
- Palace of Heavenly Purity** (乾清宫, Qiánqīng Gōng)
- Shicha Hai** (什刹海, Shíchà Hǎi)

**Day 4: Beijing (B/L/D)**

Today you will visit the **Great Wall of China**, one of the Eight Wonders of the Ancient World. You can climb up to the highest point and admire the spectacular view of mountains arrayed around you. Afterward, you will tour the **Summer Palace**, used by the imperial family during the Qing Dynasty. Later, you will visit the famous sites of many 2008 Olympics events: the **National Aquatics Center**, or “**Water Cube**,” and the **National Stadium**, or “**Bird’s Nest**.” For dinner, you will enjoy a meal of **Peking Duck**.

**Day 4 Attractions:**

- Great Wall of China** (万里长城, Wànlǐ Chángchéng)
- Summer Palace** (颐和园, Yíhé Yuán)
- National Aquatics Center** (国家游泳中心, Guójiā Yóuyǒng Zhōngxīn), or **Water Cube** (水立方, Shuǐ Lìfāng)
- National Stadium** (国家体育馆, Guójiā Tǐyùguǎn), or **Bird’s Nest** (鸟巢, Niǎo Cháo)

**Special Arrangements: Peking duck** (烤鸭, kǎoyā)

**Day 5: Beijing – Shanghai – Suzhou (B/L/D)**

After breakfast, you will take a flight to **Shanghai**, China’s largest city. From there you will proceed by coach to Suzhou to tour **Shantang Street**, which has a history of more than 1100 years. Here you can admire row upon row of traditional houses and shops, many of which are sandwiched between the street and the canal behind them, and some of which even feature a connecting span built over the street itself.



You will take a boat ride along the **Shantang Street Canal**, admiring the boats adorned with jasmine flowers, white orchids, and other decorations as they float to and fro. You can also enjoy a distant view of the faraway **Tiger Hill Leaning Tower** (also known as **Cloud Rock Pagoda**), which can be called China's Leaning Tower of Pisa. Afterward, you will visit one of the four most famous gardens in China, the **Lingering Garden**, which features a variety of beautiful and interesting works of architecture and landscaping. The day's tour will conclude with a tour of **Cold Mountain Temple**, made famous by the poem "Anchored at Night by Maple Bridge."

**Day 6: Suzhou – Wuxi (B/L/D)**

After breakfast, you will take a tour of the **Suzhou Embroidery Research Institute**, a silk factory that produces high-quality silk products, before heading by coach to the city of **Wuxi**. Wuxi combines stunning "mountain-and-water" scenery, beautiful lake and river views, and human ingenuity. There you will visit **Lake Tai's** famous **Turtle Head Isle**, which features a vast expanse of emerald water and peaks that appear and suddenly disappear in the lake mist, creating a magical, constantly changing scene. Turtle Head Isle has exclusive claim to the title of Lake Tai's most scenic spot, and its clean, pure mountain-and-water environment is truly a natural wonder. Climb up to the top of the turtle's "head" and let the view take your cares away. Then stroll along the shore of Lake Tai and enjoy the feeling of enchantment its beautiful scenery inspires. Afterward, you will take a tour of a **freshwater pearl farm** at Lake Tai. For dinner, you will have an opportunity to sample some delightful **Lake Tai-style cuisine**.

**Suzhou Embroidery Research Institute** (苏州丝绸刺绣研究所, Sūzhōu Sīchóu Cìxiù Yánjiūsuǒ)

**Day 7: Wuxi – Nanjing (B/L/D)**

After breakfast, you will visit **Three Kingdoms City** to follow in the footsteps of the heroes of the famous historical novel *The Romance of the Three Kingdoms* (三国演义) and experience the majestic atmosphere of the Great War of the Three Kingdoms. Then you will proceed to **Nanjing**, which served as the capital of six dynasties. There you can admire the resting place of the leader of China's democratic movement: the **Sun Yat-Sen Mausoleum**. The profound historical significance, great cultural value, and beautiful grounds of the mausoleum have earned the reverence of the Chinese people, both those within China and those abroad. You will also see the ruins of the **Ming City Wall**, the longest city wall ever built, which was constructed during the Ming Dynasty and encircles the city. Afterward, you can try some "Qinhuai" (秦淮)-style snacks as you stroll through the **Fuzi Temple night market**.

**Day 8: Nanjing – Shanghai (B/L/D)**

Today you will travel back to Shanghai. First you will visit **Old Town** and its **Temple of the Town Gods Shopping Center**, where you can get a taste of what Shanghai looked like 100 years ago. Afterward, you can take a stroll along bustling **Nanjing Road** and then admire the old European buildings, left over from colonial days, that line the Huangpu River at the **Bund**. There you can also enjoy the stunning sight of an imposing cluster of modern skyscrapers across the river in **Pudong**, an area that, though it seems



impossible, was still mostly farmland just twenty years ago. For dinner, you can try some authentic **Shanghai cuisine**.

**Day 9: Shanghai – Wuzhen – Hangzhou (B/L/D)**

After breakfast, you will head to **Hangzhou**. On the way, you will stop at **Wuzhen**, which has been called the most beautiful “water village” in China. With its canals, bridges, white walls, and black cobblestones, Wuzhen has the authentic traditional ambiance of a 1300-year-old village. After arriving in the beautiful city of Hangzhou, you will visit **West Lake**, situated between downtown Hangzhou and the surrounding hills. You will take a **boat tour** of the lake and admire the magnificent views laid out along the shore in every direction. Afterward, you will visit the **West Lake Dragon Well Tea Village**. Dinner will feature **Hangzhou cuisine**.

**Day 9 Attractions:**

**Wuzhen** (乌镇, wūzhèn)

**West Lake** (西湖, Xī Hú), including a **boat tour**

**West Lake Dragon Well Tea Village** (西湖龙井茶庄, Xīhú Lóngjǐng Cházhuāng)

**Day 10: Hangzhou – Guangzhou**

Your tour guide will take you to the airport, where you will board a flight to **Guangzhou** (Canton).

**Day 11: Guangzhou – Hong Kong or U.S.A.**

**Tour Features:**

– 4- or 5-Star accommodations throughout the trip

– a one-night stay in Guangzhou (except during Canton Fair in late October)

– travel accident insurance

**China International Travel CA, Inc. cancellation policy:** Notice of cancellation must be received by fax or mail; verbal notice only will not be considered sufficient. Please contact CIT to confirm that we have received your cancellation notice. A cancellation fee will be charged according to the following criteria:

- 60 or more days prior to departure: \$200 per person will be assessed.
- 45-59 days prior to departure: \$300 per person will be assessed.
- 30-44 days prior to departure: \$400 per person will be assessed.
- 15-29 days prior to departure: \$500 per person will be assessed.
- 3-14 days prior to departure: \$1000 per person will be assessed.
- Less than 3 days or nonappearance: 100% of total charge.

If tickets for any form of transportation (including, but not limited to, airline, cruise, or train) have already been issued or final confirmation has been received at time of cancellation, an additional penalty will be assessed in accordance with the policies of the company providing the transportation.
